

2. The Standard Basic Assistance Agreement (SBAA)

Legal Framework of UNDP



Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the UN (1946)

- ❖ Addresses P&I of the Organization and its Officials (Section 17)
- **❖** Legal Process (Sections 2,18)
- ❖ Inviolability of Premises/Archives (Sections 3 and 4)
- **❖** Tax Exemption (Sections 7,8, and 18)
- ❖ Cooperation to Facilitate the Administration of Justice (Section 21)
- Settlement of Disputes (Section 29)

Legal Framework of UNDP



The Standard Basic Assistance Agreement (SBAA)

- ❖ Host Agreement signed with each Programme Country Government
- ❖ Governments apply Privileges and Immunities (Convention) to UNDP
- Signed by most Programme Country Governments

UNDP Contract Templates



- ✓ Used for all contractual arrangements
- ✓ Address UNDP's status as international organization and its Privileges/Immunities
- ✓ New templates include a FACE SHEET and General Terms and Conditions (GTCs)
- ✓ Templates and GTCs shared with vendors as part of bidding documents (RFQs)



- ✓ Standard within the UN System
- ✓ Applicable to Goods and/or Services
- ✓ Submission of a proposal by a vendor assumes and/or signals full acceptance of UNDP's GTCs
- ✓ Any queries or concerns with UNDP's GTCs must be flagged at the time of submitting a proposal
